- ◆ Play for FUN

- ◆ Learn the rules and play by them. Always be a good sport.
- ◆ Respect your coach, your teammates, your parents, opponents and officials.
- ◆ Never argue with an official's decision.

Parents Code of Conduct

- ◆ Do not force your children to participate in sports, but support their desires to play their chosen sport. Children are involved in organized sports for their enjoyment. Make it fun.
- ◆ Encourage your child to play by the rules. Remember, children learn best by example so applaud the good plays of both teams.
- ◆ Do not embarrass your child by yelling at players, coaches or officials. By showing a positive attitude toward the game and all of its participants, your child will benefit.
- ◆ Emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit your young athlete. De-emphasize games and competition in the lower age groups.
- ◆ Know and study the rules of the game, and support the officials on and off the ice. This approach will help in the development and support of the game. Any criticism of the officials only hurts the game.
- ◆ Applaud a good effort in both victory and defeat, and enforce the positive points of the game. Never yell or physically abuse your child after a game or practice – it is destructive. Work toward removing the physical and verbal abuse in youth sports.
- ◆ Recognize the importance of volunteer coaches. They are important to the development of your child and the sport. Communicate with them and support them.
- ◆ If you enjoy the game, learn all you can about hockey – and volunteer.
- ◆ Abide by the Spectator Code of Conduct posted at the Mentor Ice Arena.

Mentor Youth Hockey Booster Club Fundraising Agreement

The mission of the Mentor Youth Hockey Booster Club (MYHBC) is to grow the Mentor Youth Hockey program and to give our players the tools they need to develop into well-rounded players and responsible citizens.

The booster club is run by a small board which meets once a month at an announced location. Meetings are open to all and will be announced in our Facebook Group (Mentor Youth Hockey) one week in advance.

Throughout the year, the MYHBC holds various fundraisers. The money raised helps to offset program costs, pays for coaching on Monday skills, decreases Ice of March Tournament fees and pays for other program-related events and needs.

The coaching services for Monday night skills sessions are funded directly through MYHBC fundraising. As a result, each family is responsible for fundraising \$100 per player through the Mentor Youth Hockey Booster Club. Full details of the 2023/2024 season fundraising activities will be announced by September 1st.

Families this year have the option to "buy-out" from fundraising by writing a \$100 check (per player) made payable to the "Mentor Youth Hockey Booster Club" due by September 30th. Fundraising participation is required in order to attend Monday night skills. This payment is separate from the Arena fees.
